The Cary Institute of Ecosystem Studies offers children entering grades 2 through 7 the opportunity to become ecologists for a week. The Eco-Discovery Day Camp is:

- a week of activities related to ecology and nature study. Children explore our 2,000 acre property through ecology experiments, hiking, arts & crafts, playing fun games and meeting the Cary Institute scientists.
- designed to encourage a sense of discovery and to stimulate the imagination of young campers as they learn about the exciting world around them.
- led by trained and experienced ecology educators. Each week is limited to 12 children.

We now offer summer programming for middle and high school students:

Art + Science: Ecology and the Art of Scientific Observation. This week-long program is open to ages 12-16 and offers students a unique opportunity to combine field ecology and artistic practice as they investigate the Cary Institute's forests, streams, and fields. Scholarships are limited, so please apply ASAP if you are interested.
